

## **February 26, 2011 - 4 Seasons Recreational Club Monthly Meeting**

Secretary's Report was approved as read by a Mark/Mick motion.

Treasurer's Report was approved as read by a Mick/Mark motion.

### **Old Business**

- Logo Stitch was recently sold and Debbie reported poor customer service from the new owner. She researched and received price quotes from 3 other suppliers. She presented the offers without identifying the suppliers. An anonymous vote was taken to use Homestead Embroidery. They offered the same shirts and stitching for nearly half the price we had been paying. Debbie also inquired about a screen printing option based on Jon's suggestion. Unless we are purchasing large quantities such as 100+ shirts, the savings wasn't worth it because of the simplicity of our design.
- Mark reported that trails had been in poor condition, but he upgraded to good with the recent snowfall.
- The tractor has been running great and we have not had any repairs. Lulich has been out to do maintenance.
- Mark and Jon met with the bank and agreed to a 4 year loan for the tractor. The remaining principal is about \$35,000.
- Our liability insurance policy was purchased from Schwartz & Shea with General Casualty Insurance Company, and the physical damage coverage for the tractor was purchased from Rockwood Insurance with Great American Insurance Company. Cancellation of the policy from Midwest Family Mutual has been requested and we should receive a refund within the next couple of weeks.
- Swords ATV poker run is today. Club members will be at local businesses to help stamp cards and sell raffle tickets. Debbie has envelope packets with tickets for each volunteer.
- Tour of business has been scheduled for April 16. Dick has organized the event and Doris will draft and print postcards.
- Mick noticed that we had paid for the NW Shopper ads for the snowmobile safety class. She will present to the Get-Er-Done club to share in the cost of the ads as the class was a joint effort.

### **New Business**

- Debbie has information about the AWSC Convention for anyone who is interested in attending. Tim Johnson and John Detterling will be designated as our delegates to the convention.
- The youth turkey hunt will be 4/12/11. They will be using the building again this year.

- Jon presented information about the Way of Life Festival. A promoter will be approaching the town board to apply for a permit to hold a concert event at the ball park on 9/17/11. The event will feature several regional bands and will invite local businesses to be vendors and provide food, beverages, etc . They will also invite a snowmobile/ATV dealer and will have a raffle for a snowmobile so they want the event to be near a trail. The promoter will bring a generator to supply power for the bands, but they will need electricity. Since the club pays the electric at the ball park, we will negotiate the cost with the promoter. Cost to vendors will be \$500. Tim suggested a possible joint venture with the Get-Er-Done club to sell food. This is a 12 hour event with a set and clean up day, so we will need many volunteers.
- Dolly McNamara from the Get-Er-Done club arrived early to invite our club to participate in a Minute To Win It Contest. They will also invite other area clubs. She would like one or two people from each club to help plan the event and the games. Preliminary plans are to have 5 members from each club perform 10 tasks in a double elimination contest. She suggested an entry fee of \$5 per person and \$1 admission fee. The contest is scheduled for May 14 at 3:00 at McNamaras.
- Town election is 4/5/11.
- Volunteers needed for future meat raffles. There will only be one meat raffle in March on 3/5.
- Debbie received a promotional flyer from The Power Doctors which is a new business providing small engine repair. They are located at 1107 Ogden Avenue, Superior, WI and may be contact at 218-341-7560.
